From the ministry team

Finding Treasure at Easter

There was a news article on the BBC the other day on a new Egg Hunt in London. 100 giant decorated eggs will be 'hidden' around London and after Easter sold, raising money for charity.

Back in 2012 a similar event was run; I was living in the capital at the time and some friends and I tried to find a few - we were a long way from finding them all! For that event there was a prize - if you recorded your find on the app you were placed in a prize draw to win "The Jubilee Egg", made by Fabergé and worth around £100,000. You could also visit the Fabergé shop to see this prize egg - which my friends and I did. While we were there a man and his young son were also looking at the egg. The shop assistant offered the boy a chance to hold the golden egg. He held out his hands and was given the precious object. He then, to the horror of his dad (and the concern of the nearby security officer) turned to just walk out of the shop - £100,000 egg in hand! The dad swiftly told the boy - "No, that has to stay here!" and the egg was returned safely to the shop staff.

At Easter, Christians celebrate the most precious gift of all - Jesus' death and resurrection. Jesus sacrificed himself on the cross, so that he might take on the consequences of our wrong doings. He did this, so that we would never be separated from God. This gift brings hope, peace, and joy. We are not perfect - we all do things that are wrong sometimes, but in Jesus there is forgiveness, the chance to wipe the slate clean, to not carry our mistakes around with us forever; and there is promise of life after death - eternal life with God and with our loved ones.

We may, like the boy, not realise the value of what it is that we have been freely given. But unlike the boy, the gift is not one that we must return, but that is ours. All we are asked to do is to open our hands and accept.

Maundy Thursday, time to wash feet

Maundy Thursday is famous for two things. The first is one of the final acts that Jesus did before His death: the washing of His own disciples' feet (see John 13). Jesus washed His disciples' feet for a purpose: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." His disciples were to love through service, not domination, of one another.

In Latin, the opening phrase of this sentence is *'mandatum novum do vobis'*. The word 'maundy' is thus a corruption of the Latin 'mandatum' (or command). The ceremony of the 'washing of the feet' of members of the congregation came to be an important part of the liturgy (regular worship) of the medieval church, symbolising the humility of the clergy, in obedience to the example of Christ.

But Thursday was also important because it was on that night that Jesus first introduced the Lord's Supper, or what we nowadays call Holy Communion.

Jesus and His close friends had met in a secret upper room to share the Passover meal together - for the last time. And there Jesus transformed the Passover into the Lord's Supper, saying, 'this is my body' and 'this is my blood' as He, the Lamb of God, prepared to die for the sins of the whole world. John's gospel makes it clear that the Last Supper took place the evening BEFORE the regular Passover meal, and that later Jesus died at the same time that the Passover lambs were killed.

Afterwards tea/coffee and hot cross buns will be served in the church.

News from Downham School

In March, we celebrated British Science Week at Downham Church of England Primary School. The Revd Jacqui started our week by leading a Collective Worship based on Thomas, Jesus' disciple, who had many questions following the resurrection. We thought about the importance of asking questions and looking for evidence. This thread ran throughout the week as we explored the theme of Changes and Adaptations. Some children investigated how animals have adapted to suit their environments, others studied antigens and antibodies. One class considered the issue of microplastic pollution and how it harms marine animals, helping the children to come up with ideas for how they can adapt their behaviour to try and solve this problem.

Our Science Week investigations connect well with how we have also been thinking about Lent and the opportunities this season provides for us to make changes to our mindset and our actions. We have encouraged the children to take on a series of challenges to bring positive change to the world around us. These challenges include making Easter cards or pictures for neighbours, learning how to help with jobs around the home, and sitting with different people at lunch time in the school's dinner hall. Lent is also a time for reflecting on the message of Easter and the centrality of Jesus' death and resurrection to the Christian faith. In RE lessons, children have been considering big questions such as "Why do Christians call the day Jesus died Good Friday?" and "What difference does the resurrection make to Christians?" These challenging questions help us to consider the hope that Christians have because of the resurrection. Christians believe that Jesus has overcome death and that one day all bad and sad things will be gone forever. What a glorious message of hope!

All of us at Downham Church of England Primary School would like to wish everyone in our local community a very happy and blessed Easter. May it be a time of positive change and hope for us all.

Bell

St Peter's only has a single tolling bell, but it is many years since it was last rung. We have been keen to see if the bell could be rung again and Marguerite was able to persuade Nigel Taylor, the Diocesan Bells adviser and one of the bell-ringers at Downham, to come and have a look. Nigel formerly worked for the Whitechapel Bell Foundry and is an expert at everything to do with bells. So, a couple of weeks ago Nigel came to take a look. The frame, the bell and the spire structure are in great condition. The bell dates from the 1600s, but was rehung in 1890. When the spire was reshingled in 1980 the builders worked around the bell and took great care not to disturb it. The

bell was cast by the Bartlett family, who owned the Whitechapel Bell Foundry from 1619 until the end of the 17th century. Our bell rings a sharp F (not to be confused with F sharp!). Nigel oiled all the bearings and it is now good to go - Jon Spriggs has already had a go, apparently it is not as easy as it looks. We are planning to ring the bell before all future services, just in case you need waking up on a Sunday morning.

All in the month of April

It was:

250 years ago, on 18 April 1775 that American silversmith and folk hero Paul Revere made his famous midnight ride on horseback from Charleston to Lexington to warn residents that the British were about to attack.

Also 250 years ago, on 23 April 1775 that J M W Turner, the British artist was born. Known for his landscapes and turbulent marine paintings.

175 years ago, on 16 April 1850 that Madame Marie Tussaud, French artist

known for her wax sculptures, died. Founder of Madame Tussaud's wax museum in London.

Also 175 years ago, on 23 April 1850 that William Wordsworth died. A Romantic poet, he was Poet Laureate from 1843-50.

150 years ago, on 1 April 1875 that Edgar Wallace was born. This British writer, playwright and journalist was best known for creating King Kong.

Also 150 years ago, on 17 April 1875 that the game of snooker was invented by Neville Chamberlain, a British army officer stationed in India.

125 years ago, from 14 April - 12 November, that the 1900 Paris Exposition, a World's Fair, was held. Nearly 50 million people visited Paris that year.

100 years ago, on 10 April 1925 that F Scott Fitzgerald's novel The Great Gatsby, was published.

80 years ago, from 1 April to 22 June 1945 that the Battle of Okinawa, Japan took place. The largest amphibious assault in the Pacific War, it was an Allied victory.

Also 80 years ago, on 30 April 1945 that Adolf Hitler, Austrian-born German Nazi Party Leader, Chancellor of Germany (1933-45) and dictator (1934-45) committed suicide along with his wife, Eva Braun.

70 years ago, on 5 April 1955 that Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced his retirement because of failing health. He was succeeded by Anthony Eden on 7 April.

Also 70 years ago, on 10 April 1955 that British nightclub hostess Ruth Ellis shot and killed her lover, David Blakely. On 13 July she was hanged at Holloway Prison, the last woman to be executed in the UK.

Also 70 years ago, on 18 April 1955, that Albert Einstein, German-born American theoretical physicist, died. Considered the most influential physicist of the 20th century. Known for developing the special and general theories of relativity.

65 years ago, on 1 April 1960 that Dr Martens boots went on sale in the UK.

50 years ago, on 4 April 1975 that Microsoft, the computer software/hardware company, was founded by Bill Gates and Paul Allen in Albuquerque New Mexico.

Also 50 years ago, on 23 April 1975 that US President Gerald Ford gave a televised speech in which he announced that the USA's involvement in the Vietnam war was over, and all US aid to South Vietnam had ended. The war itself ended on 30 April, when North Vietnamese forces captured the South Vietnamese capital Saigon.

40 years ago, on 21 April 1985 that Brazilian racing driver Ayrton Senna won the Portuguese Grand Prix. It was the first of his 41 Formula One wins.

Also 40 years ago, on 23 April 1985 that the Coca-Cola Company changed the formula of Coca-Cola and launched it on the market as New Coke. The public were out-raged, and the original formula was restored within three months.

30 years ago, on 4 April 1995 that Kenny Everett, DJ, comedian and TV entertainer, died. Known for his zany humour, characters and sketches.

Also 30 years ago, on 19 April 1995 that the Oklahoma City bombing took place. A truck bomb exploded outside the Alfred P Murrah Federal Building, killing 168 people and injuring 500 more. Timothy McVeigh was convicted of the bombing and executed in June 2001.

25 years ago, on 12 April 2000 that Queen Elizabeth II awarded the Royal Ulster Constabulary the George Cross in recognition of its collective and sustained bravery during the Troubles in Northern Ireland.

Also 25 years ago, on 22 April 2000 that the 'The Big Number' change took place on the UK's telephone system. Many area codes were updated or replaced, and new ones created for mobile, freephone, local rate, national rate, and premium rate services.

20 years ago, on 2 April 2005 that Pope John Paul II died. Succeeded by Pope Benedict XVI on 19 April.

Also 20 years ago, on 9 April 2005 that Charles, Prince of Wales, married Camilla Parker Bowles, who gained the title the Duchess of Cornwall.

15 years ago, on 20 April 2010 that BP's Deepwater Horizon oil platform in the Gulf of Mexico exploded, killing 11 workers. Around 210 million US gallons of crude oil were spilled, causing an environmental disaster. BP was fined \$18.7 billion - the largest settlement in US corporate history.

10 years ago, on 2 April 2015 that the Gorkha earthquake took place in Nepal. Nearly 9,000 people were killed, 22,000 injured, and 3.5 million made homeless.


