# From the ministry team

#### In the Bleak Midwinter

Which is your favourite Christmas carol? Silent Night, perhaps? Or Away in the Manger? O Little Town of Bethlehem?



I can find it difficult to choose just one favourite, but a carol that I always find quite emotional to sing is 'In the Bleak Midwinter'. It is a poem by Christina Rossetti that was later put to music, and it beautifully captures, for me, the joy and the hope of Christmas - especially the second verse:

Our God, Heaven cannot hold Him Nor earth sustain Heaven and earth shall flee away When He comes to reign In the bleak mid-winter A stable-place sufficed Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ

The world can feel very bleak at times - not least because of the dark, cold weather, but because of events going on in the world, in our lives, or in the lives of our family and friends. Christmas lights, festivities, presents, and food are a welcomed tonic to the dark and the cold of this time of year (bring on the mulled wine and the minced pies!) but they are fleeting. January will come.

Yet what Christina Rossetti describes in her poem is a gift of light, of hope, of love, that transcends everything else and is unending. Jesus, the Son of God, the creator of the world, of the universe, chose to become a small, vulnerable

baby, in a land under Roman occupation. A simple stable housed the Lord God Almighty.

Why? So that we might know God, and know his love for us. No matter how bleak the winter may be (or indeed how bright the winter sunshine); God's love is unfailing and unending.

So as we celebrate in church, in our homes - as we sing carols in the pub, the barn, around the Christmas tree - however and wherever you celebrate Christmas this year, may you know the gift of God's presence with you and his love for you.

How might we respond to this gift? Christina Rossetti answers this beautifully in her carol as well:

What can I give Him Poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would give a lamb If I were a wise man, I would do my part Yet what I can, I give Him Give my heart

### Christmas throughout the Christian world

For nearly four weeks leading up to Christmas Christians recognise a period called Advent. It means 'coming'. It is a time of spiritual preparation. 'Coming' refers to Jesus' first coming as a baby, but it also looks forward to a day when Jesus is expected to return in triumph at his 'second coming' to establish perfect justice and a new order of peace.

Originally Christians marked Advent as a time when they refrained from excessive eating and drinking. Then Christmas Day reintroduced them to the joys of feasting. Christmas celebrations lasted for twelve days, with gifts exchanged as a climax at Epiphany (6 January). Today, however, Advent is more likely to be associated with accelerating festivity, with the days following Christmas something of an anti-climax until 'twelfth night', on which decorations are removed. Many Christians worldwide are trying to revive the spirit of Advent by setting aside time to pray and address global poverty.

Christmas Day is celebrated as the anniversary of Jesus' birth, although the actual date is not known. Most Christians celebrate it on 25 December. However, the Orthodox Church (the ancient churches in Eastern Europe and parts of Asia) follows a different calendar and celebrates on 7 January. Christians make a point of taking communion on Christmas Day. Many make it the first thing they do as the clock strikes midnight.

On 6 January the Christmas festival continues with a celebration of Epiphany, which means 'the appearance'. Christians remember the visit of wise men (magi) to Jesus, bringing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. The Christmas tradition of exchanging gifts originally honoured these men, who were the first non-Jews (Gentiles) to worship Jesus. It forms a reminder that in Jesus God was giving Himself for the benefit of the entire world.

Orthodox Christians use this day to recall the baptism of Jesus as a grown man. The significance of Jesus being baptised was that He identified Himself with human beings in all their need. They mark the day by praying for God's blessing on rivers, wells and water sources.

Christmas has never been just an escapist festival for Christians. Those who treat it seriously recognise that not all the world is able to face the days with frivolity or joy. The day after Christmas, Boxing Day, was historically marked as the feast of St Stephen. He was the first man to be put to death rather than give up his belief that Jesus was God. And two days later a day remembering the Massacre of the Innocents recalls Herod's attempt to destroy Jesus by killing all male babies in Bethlehem. Although not so widely marked as Christmas Day, it gives Christians the opportunity to pray for children in today's world who suffer as a result of the actions of adults.

# Iconic Bethlehem Carol Sheet celebrates 70 years in print

If you attend one of our carol services at St Peter's or St Mary's you will be handed a copy of the Bethlehem Carol Sheet containing the words of the carols we will be using. What is the history of this publication?

It was back in 1954 when the charity, BibleLands Mission Aid Society, first tentatively decided to print a colourful compilation of popular Christmas carols, alongside images of some of the people BibleLands served.


From the start, the scheme was an immense success. The carol sheets were so popular that even that first year, 100,000 copies were insufficient to meet the demand of schools, churches, British army bases at home and abroad and Royal Navy ships across the world. The donations appeal towards the BibleLands projects in the carol sheet also raised hundreds of pounds.

When 500,000 copies were quickly sold in 1955, BibleLands knew it had a winner on its hands.

So it was that, in 1956, with 1.5 million carol sheets sales as the target, an accompanying catalogue of Christmas cards and gifts and prayers for God's favour was also launched. The plan was overwhelmingly successful – much needed funds were raised for the work of BibleLands.


Since then, many millions of carol sheets have been sold, until this year the charity, now renamed Embrace the Middle East, has produced a new-look Edition with 27 popular carols, including three new additions for this year: O Holy Night, See Him Lying on a Bed of Straw (Calypso Carol) and The Angel Gabriel from Heaven Came.

Note: We purchased new copies last year, so it won't be the new look edition we will be using.


