

Happy Birthday!

Raise your hand if your birthday is in June.....

Happy Birthday!

You may (or may not!) be interested to know some of the famous faces who also have a birthday this month. They include: Morgan Freeman (1st), Sir Paul McCartney (18th), and Ariana Grande (26th).

In June we also celebrate Pentecost, which is sometimes called the church's birthday!

Pentecost does not fall on a fixed date, but it rather marks the 50th day of Easter. It is the day when, following his ascension up to heaven, Jesus sends the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. The gift the Holy Spirit (part of the Trinity of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit) at Pentecost means that God is always present with us.

The gospel writer Luke tells us the story in the second chapter of the book Acts in the New Testament. The disciples are gathered in one place and then the Holy Spirit descends from heaven, landing on each one like a 'tongue of fire'. They then speak in the different languages of all those present in the diverse crowd. From there the disciples would travel across the known world, and beyond, spreading the new of Jesus' death and resurrection, and giving the good news of sins forgiven and life after death.

Pentecost is therefore a special day in our churches - some churches do even celebrate with birthday cake! This year Pentecost falls on 8 June.

Whether you have a birthday this month or not, I hope you have a wonderful June.

June, of course is the month of the summer solstice, the month of the Sun. Sol + stice come from two Latin words meaning 'sun' and 'to stand still'. As the days lengthen, the sun rises higher and higher until it seems to stand still in the sky. The Summer Solstice results in the longest day and the shortest night of the year. The Northern Hemisphere celebrates in June, and the Southern Hemisphere celebrates in December.

Connection and Community at Downham Church of England Primary School

Perhaps you have heard of "The Daily Mile" campaign which encourages children to run a mile every day? At Downham Church of England Primary School, we have adapted this to "Walk and Talk". Twice a week, two or three classes spend some time walking together – building friendships across year groups and getting to know one another. In the midst of busy days, weeks and terms, we believe it is important to provide these opportunities for building connection and community.

There is increasing scientific evidence on the value of friendship in promoting well-being and good mental health. We all need at least one friend to come alongside us to support, encourage and love us. With increasing numbers of children and young people feeling lonely and anxious, it has never been more important to build strong support networks around the children in our care. Walking and talking together is just one of the ways in which we do this.

Another way of building up our school community is through our daily acts of Collective Worship. We gather together to sing and reflect on Bible stories, which often remind us of God's love and presence with us. Friendship with God is the ultimate friendship; He promises to never leave nor forsake us. How wonderful to be able to share this with the children in our care. We are currently considering how "Easter Changes Everything" – learning about the community of believers who established the Early Church with the help of the Holy Spirit. It has been so encouraging to learn how ordinary men and women were filled with God's power and became courageous and confident to change the world. It is our hope that the children of Downham C of E Primary School will know that same courage and confidence as they too seek to change the world and make it a better place.

All in the month of June

It was:

500 years ago, on 13 June 1525, that German Protestant Reformer Martin Luther married Katharina von Bora, a nun whom he had helped to escape from a convent.

250 years ago, on 14 June 1775, that the Second Continental Congress established the Continental Army. Later it became the United States Army. On 15 June, George Washington, who would become first President of the USA, became the Army's Commander-in-Chief. This army would defeat the British army, and America would declare independence the following year, on 4 July 1776.

Also 250 years ago, on 23 June 1775, that the first Thames Regatta was held in London.

175 years ago, on 24 June 1850, that Herbert Kitchener, the 1st Earl Kitchener, was born. This Irish-born British Army officer and politician became Secretary of War during WW1, when he appeared on an iconic poster asking people to join the army. He was killed in 1916 when his ship was hit by a German mine.

150 years ago, on 3 June 1875, that George Bizet, French Romantic composer, died of a heart attack at 36. Best known for his opera Carmen.

125 years ago, on 25 June 1900, that Louis Mountbatten, 1st Earl Mountbatten of Burma, was born. He became Governor-General of India (1947-48), First Sea Lord (1955-59), and Chief of the Defence Staff (1959-65). Assassinated in 1979 by an IRA bomb planted on his fishing boat.

90 years ago, on 1 June 1935, that driving tests became compulsory for all new drivers in Britain.

80 years ago, on 22 June 1945, that the Battle of Okinawa in Japan ended (after 82 days). This battle saw the highest number of casualties in the Pacific Theatre of the war, with more than 12,000 forces, 110,000 Japanese forces, and 140,000 civilians killed.

75 years ago, on 3 June 1950, that the first successful ascent of Annapurna in the Himalayas was made. It was a French expedition and the first successful ascent of a mountain over 8,000 metres. Annapurna is the tenth highest mountain in the world.

70 years ago, on 11 June 1955 that the Le Mans disaster took place. A car spun off the track during the Le Mans 24 Hour race in France, and the driver, Pierre Levegh, and 83 spectators were killed, with 100 more injured. It was the greatest loss of life in the history of motorsport, but bizarrely, the race was not stopped. The survivors carried on for the full 24 hours, while the dead and the injured were removed from the site.

65 years ago, on 28 June 1960, that the Six Bells Colliery disaster took place in Monmouthshire Wales. 45 coal miners were killed by a gas explosion.

50 years ago, on 7 June 1975, that the first Cricket World Cup to be held in England began.

Also 50 years ago, on 18 June 1975, that the first North Sea oil was pumped ashore to Britain.

40 years ago, on 2 June 1985 that UEFA banned all English football clubs from playing in European competitions following the Heysel Stadium disaster of 28 May. The ban was lifted after five years.

30 years ago, on 25 June 1995 that Ernest Walton, Irish physicist died. He was the first person to split an atom.

25 years ago, on 10 June 2000, that the Millenium Bridge opened in London. It closed for a while two days later, when it was found to sway uncomfortably when people walked in step.

15 yeas ago, on 28 June 2010, that the US Supreme Court ruled that American citizens have the right to own a gun, regardless of which state they live in. The right is protected by the Second and the Fourteenth Amendments. There are an estimated 393 million privately owned guns in the USA, and about 340 million people.

Open Farm Sunday – 8 June



Do you have any farms near to where you live? Then this month, they might just provide you with an interesting day out!

For June brings Open Farm Sunday, which can be a "fabulous opportunity for the public to discover the crucial work farmers do in producing food, nurturing nature, and protecting the environment for future generations."

So says the website, www.farmsunday.org . And on the day, nearly 200 farms throughout the country will be welcoming the public to come and see their farms.

From Inverness to Cornwall, about 170 farms will be putting on guided tours, self-guided walking routes and static displays as part of the event. Visitors will be able to take part in a national pollinators survey. This will involve standing near a crop area for five minutes to count pollinating insects before doing a comparative count in a different habitat.

The day is organised by the group Linking Environment And Farming (LEAF). Editor's note: Not sure if any of the farms in our villages are taking part, but it is worth visiting Downham Hall Farm, next to St Margaret's Downham. They now have a farm shop and locally produced milk, cream, cheese and yogurt for sale.

What about Facebook after you die?

David Pickup, a solicitor, considers what might happen to your Facebook page when you die.

The righteous perish, and no one takes it to heart; the devout are taken away, and no one understands that the righteous are taken away to be spared from evil. Those who walk uprightly enter into peace; they find rest as they lie in death' (Isaiah 57:1-2 NIV)

What happens to our Facebook page when we die is probably the last thing on most of our minds. However, many people have an 'online presence' such as Facebook pages, Linked-in, email accounts, Instagram and all sorts of bank accounts and website pages. Who can get access to that information? Depending on the type of account, a relative or friend might want to close it, retrieve information or images or preserve it in some way. Making a Will is an

opportunity to make a clear decision about what happens to things you own, and this includes something electronic and who carries out your wishes.

According to Facebook, you can choose to either appoint a legacy contact to look after your account, or have your account permanently deleted from


to look after your account, or have your account permanently deleted from Facebook. If you do not choose to have your account permanently deleted, it will be memorialised if Facebook are told about the death. Memorialised accounts are a place for friends and family to gather and share memories after a person has passed away.

Google encourages people to think about these issues and they have something called an Inactive Account Manager to let them know who should have access to your information, and whether you want your account to be deleted.

They recognise that many people pass away without leaving clear instructions about how to manage their online accounts. They work with immediate family members and representatives to close the account of a deceased person where appropriate. In certain circumstances they may provide content from a deceased user's account.

The best advice is to think carefully and make choices about what happens in the event of your passing, and carefully select someone you trust to do this. As ever this is a light-hearted introduction and if in any doubt get proper advice. Different companies have different policies and procedures so always check carefully.
