

From the ministry team

Remember

In November the church marks 'Remembrance Season', with a theme of both individual and corporate remembrance.

The first of November is All Saints' Day, when we remember men and women whom the church recognises as having lived lives of faith through their words and actions, and whom we can follow as an example in our own lives. Then on 2 November we mark All Souls' Day - a day to remember all of our loved ones who have died, whether recently or a number of years ago, and to give thanks for all they mean to us.

Then, on Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day we remember, with gratitude, the sacrifices that many have given in the past for peace, justice, and freedom, and we remember those who are still serving in the armed forces around the world.

Remembering can often be a painful thing. Whether our loved one died recently or many years ago, the ache of their absence can be strong, and there may be pain of regrets or memories of hurt. We remember also the pain and suffering of the two world wars, as well as other wars and conflicts, and remember that so many people around the world still suffer from violence and injustice.

Yet remembering can also bring hope and joy. We remember the good times with our departed loved ones - the memories that really make us smile; the small things which make us think of them every day; we also remember the bravery of the armed forces and civilians in time of war.

It is also a good time to remember that Jesus, whose death and resurrection we remember at Holy Communion each week, is the one in whom we can trust in good times and bad.

At the end of November the church celebrates the feast of Christ the King. On that feast day we remember that Jesus is the Lord of heaven and earth. We remember, as we approach Advent and Christmas, that Jesus the King humbled himself by coming to live among us as a vulnerable baby, living a life of joy and loss, till he willingly gave up his life on the cross, so that we may enjoy the assurance of eternal life with him.

I pray that this remembrance season we may know that Jesus is with us and for us, in the good times and the bad, and journeys with us in whatever we feel this remembrance season.

All Souls' Day – a time of reckoning with the past

The Church commemorates All Souls' on 2 November.

The early Church was slow to dedicate a liturgical day to offering prayers and masses to commemorate the faithful departed. But in time prayers were offered on behalf of dead monks, that they might attain 'the Beatific Vision' through purification, which the Church later described as Purgatory. Odilo, the powerful abbot of Cluny, (d 1049) decreed that All Souls' Day should follow the feast of All Saints' Day.

At least four ancient English dedications are known, the most famous of which are All Souls College, Oxford and the church in Langham Place in London.

In bygone centuries All Souls' Day was certainly uncomfortable for anyone who had wronged a person who had then died. For it was believed that souls in purgatory could appear on earth on this day, in the form of ghosts, witches or toads, to haunt anyone who had wronged them in life.

On a more cheerful note, it was also believed that you could help the dead on this day by almsgiving in cash or in kind. Some of these beliefs seem to have been caught up in the popular customs of Hallowe'en.

When the Reformation came, the Protestants disregarded the idea of Purgatory, and this feast day remained with the Roman Catholic Church.

All in the month of November

It was

250 years ago, on 22 November 1774 that Robert Clive, 1st Baron Clive (Clive of India), died. He was the British general who helped found the British Empire in India.

150 years ago, on 23 November 1874 that Thomas Hardy's novel Far from the Madding Crowd was published. It was his first major success.

125 years ago, from 2 November 1899 to 28 February 1900 that the Siege of Ladysmith, a British Colony of Natal, took place. The Boers surrounded the town and cut off the rail link, starving the British defenders. A relief party, which included future British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, arrived on 28 February. British victory.

100 years ago, on 2 November 1924 that the first crossword puzzle to appear in a British newspaper was published in the Sunday Express.

Also 100 years ago, on 4 November 1924 that Gabriel Fauré, the French composer, died.

Also 100 years ago, on 19 November 1924 that Thomas Ince, the 'Father of

the Western' died. This American silent film producer, director, screenwriter and actor created the first major Hollywood studio, and invented film production.

Also 100 years ago, on 29 November 1924 that Giacomo Puccini, Italian composer, died. Known for his operas, including La Boheme, Tosca and Madame Butterfly.

90 years ago, on 30 November 1934 that the British steam locomotive, Flying Scotsman, became the first train officially to reach 100 mph.

80 years ago, on 12 November 1944 that the British RAF bombed and sank the German battleship Tirpitz, sister ship of the Bizmark, off Norway.

70 years ago, on 3 November 1954 that Henri Matisse died. This French artist was leader of the Fauvist movement and is seen as the most important French painter of the 20th century.

Also 70 years ago, on 13 November 1954 that the first Rugby League World Cup Final was held, in Paris, France. Great Britain beat France 16 – 12.

65 years ago, on 1 November 1959 that the first stretch of the M1 motorway opened in Britain. Britain's first motorway service station also opened at Watford Gap.

60 years ago, on 23 November 1964 that the Second Vatican Council allowed the use of vernacular languages (such as English) in Roman Catholic sacraments and rituals, including the Mass. It had insisted on using only Latin for several hundred years. Most people welcomed the change, and the use of Latin guickly dwindled.

50 years ago, on 8 November 1974 that British aristocrat Lord Lucan disappeared from his home in London after his children's nanny was bludgeoned to death and his wife was attacked. There were hundreds of claims of sightings around the world in the following years, but none were substantiated. He was never found and is presumed dead.

Also 50 years ago, on 20 November 1974 that British politician John Stonehouse faked his death by leaving a pile of clothing on a beach in Miami, Florida. He was found alive and well in Australia on 24 December, and was arrested on suspicion of being Lord Lucan.

Also 50 years ago, on 25 November 1974 that South African heart surgeon Dr Christian Barnard performed the world's first double heart transplant. The original heart was left in place and a donor heart was connected to it to support its workload.

40 years ago, on 20 November 1984 that SETI (the Search for Extra-Terrestrial Intelligence) was founded in Mountain View, California.

40 years ago, on 25 November 1984 that 36 musicians gathered in London

to record the Band Aid single Do They Know It's Christmas to raise money for famine relief in Ethiopia.

30 years ago, on 14 November 1994 that the first fare-paying passengers travelled through the Channel Tunnel linking England and France.

Also 30 years ago, on 19 November 1994 that Britain's first National Lottery draw was held.

25 years ago, on 29 November 1999 that the Northern Ireland Assembly appointed its first power sharing executive committee.


15 years ago, on 26 November 2009 that the Murphy Commission of Inquiry published its damning report on the abuse of children by Roman Catholic priests in Dublin during 1975 - 2004. It was found that church leaders had conspired with the Garda to cover up the abuse.

10 years ago, on 3 November 2014 that the One World Trade Center officially opened in New York City. It replaced the World Trade Center that was destroyed in the 9/11 terrorist attacks in 2001.

Also 10 years ago, on 27 November 2014 that P D James, British novelist, died. Best known for her crime novels featuring the detective, Adam Dalgliesh.
